

ST KITTS & NEVIS INTERNATIONAL SHIP REGISTRY MARITIME CIRCULAR – MC 147 25

APPLICATION FOR SEAFARERS' DOCUMENTS

1. Purpose

- 1.1. The purpose of this Maritime Circular is to provide an update on the procedure and requirements of the Registry in relation to the application for seafarers' documents.
- 1.2. This Maritime Circular revokes previously issued MC 30 09 on this matter.

2. Application

- 2.1. In accordance with the current working process, inquiries and applications for seafarers' certificates are accepted through Seafarer HQ and/or by e-mail.
- 2.2. Application Form A15 (Application for Seafarers Documents) gives a full check list of requirements for the support documents (on pages 3 & 4), which are necessary for the processing of the application and are required to be uploaded to Seafarers HQ. - 2.3. This Administration would like to emphasize that only fully completed application forms with all required valid supporting documents will be processed. Therefore, this Administration reminds that this is a responsibility of an applicant and/or seafarers' representatives to ensure that application forms are duly completed and to check that all supporting documents, including the Q3-Form, are provided in accordance with the requirements which are specified in Application Form A 15.

Certificates of Endorsements

2.4. This Administration requires that requests for Certificates of Endorsements should only be applied for if the Certificate of Competency has at least 6 months validity before expiration.

Seafarer's Medical Certificates

- 2.5. All seafarers serving onboard St. Kitts and Nevis flagged vessels should be in possession of a valid medical health certificate. Therefore, we require that all medical health certificates for seafarers should have at least 6 months of validity before expiration when applying for seafarer documents.
- 2.6. This requirement ensures that seafarers are medically fit for duty onboard a vessel throughout their employment, in accordance with the provisions of the MLC 2006, as amended, that emphasizes the importance of medical fitness for seafarers, including requirements for pre-employment and periodic medical examinations according to the International Labour Organization (ILO).
- 2.7. Generally, seafarers must undergo a medical examination to obtain the medical fitness certificate, which is valid for a specific period (usually one or two years, depending on age), and the certificates need to be valid at the time of joining a vessel and throughout the period of employment.

Temporary Exception

- 2.8. In certain urgent situations, such as when a seafarer is hired at short notice, this Administration may allow for the seafarer to join a vessel with a medical certificate that has expired within the last 3 months.
- 2.9. This exception is only temporary, and the seafarer is expected to obtain a new medical fitness certificate at the next port of call.

Adherence to these procedures will considerably assist this Administration in providing a first-rate service for seafarer registration.
